



A key-logger is a program that records everything that you type on a keyboard. All of your keystrokes are stored, in order, in a log file, hence the name "key logger." The log file is intended to be read by a third party that is typically unknown, remote and malicious. Key-loggers do have legitimate uses, such as troubleshooting, training, analyzing employee productivity, and law enforcement surveillance. But key-loggers are most often used illegally to spy on people.

While a good up-to-date antivirus should be able to prevent/detect/remove key loggers, it is always good to have some other ways to double check and make sure your computer is free of this nasty type of malware.
